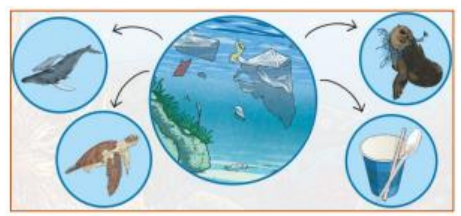

WORD	DEFINITION
Beach	A beach is an area of sand or small stones along the coast.
Cliff	A cliff is a steep rocky slope at the edge of the sea.
Coast	The coast is the area where the land meets the sea.
Continent	A large solid area of land.
Harbour	A harbour is a sheltered place where ships or boats moor.
Ocean	An ocean is a large body of water.
Port	A port is a place where ships load and unload
Sea	A sea is a large body of water partially enclosed by land.
Town	A town is an area larger than a village but smaller than a city

- ❖ There are **7 continents** - from largest to smallest they are: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, Australia (also known as Oceania).
- ❖ There are **5 oceans** – from largest to smallest Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern, Arctic.
- ❖ Over 70% of the Earth's surface is water.
- ❖ The deepest known area of the Earth's oceans is known as the Mariana Trench.
- ❖ A seaside resort has many physical features. Features such as the beach, the sea, cliffs and caves have been made naturally. This means they were made by nature.
- ❖ Human features found at the seaside might include the pier, the promenade, a lighthouse, and a fairground. These features are all man-made.
- ❖ At least 14 million tons of plastic end up in our oceans every year.

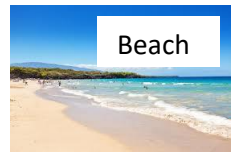

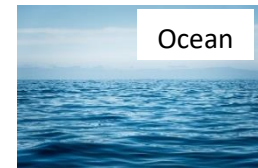
