WORD	DEFINITION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ The first Ilkley village school was built in 1637. ❖ The first All Saints' National school was built and opened in 1872. ❖ As the population grew in 1894 a second school building was built on Leeds Road. ❖ Church buildings were used as dining halls as the numbers of children grew. ❖ In 2002 All Saints' moved to the current site on Skipton Road. ❖ All Saints Infants building on Leeds Road was demolished in 2004 ❖ In Victorian times girls and boys were educated in separate parts of the building. ❖ Children wrote on slates with chalk. ❖ Children were punished if they didn't know their times tables ❖ There was up to 60 children in each classroom. 	 <p>William Edward Forster from Burley in Wharfedale was Parliamentary minister for education and brought in the Compulsory Education Act of 1870.</p>
